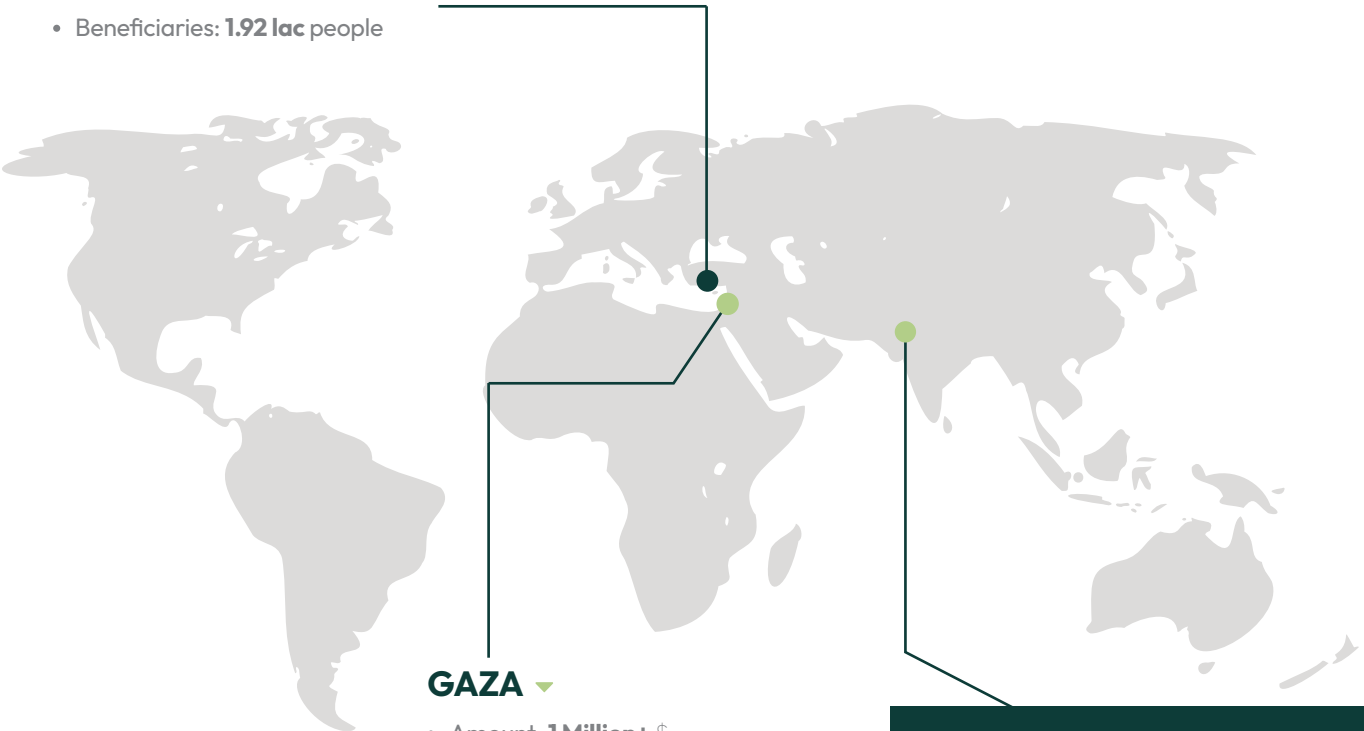

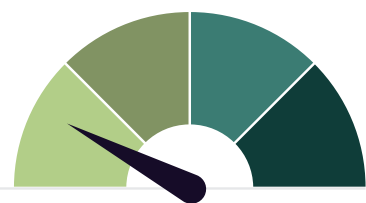

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS AND IMPACT



Pak Aid Welfare Trust has consistently delivered impactful humanitarian services across Pakistan and internationally. Below is a summary of the largest initiatives, categorized by year, beneficiaries and achievements.



Over the years, our organization has impacted more than 7.5 million people across Pakistan and AJK through disaster response, development, and humanitarian programs. We have provided emergency relief during floods, earthquakes, and COVID-19, constructed 20 fully furnished homes, 58 mosques, over 10,000 tent shelters, 10+ tent mosques and schools, and 50 bamboo huts. More than 850,000 people and 400,000+ animals gained access to clean water through 1,150+ water systems, while 500,000+ individuals and 250 animals benefited from healthcare and veterinary camps. We delivered 500,000+ ration packages, cooked meals to over 1.1 million families, supported 235,500+ households during Ramadan, distributed 270,000+ Eid relief packages, and reached 1.5 million people through Qurbani programs. Our education initiatives have supported 50,000+ students, including 500 through computer labs and 250 through solar-powered labs. We also installed 22,000 water coolers, provided vocational training to over 1,000 women and orphans, improved livelihoods through 50 welding plants and 250 goats, and planted more than 15,000 trees. Powered by a network of 70,000+ volunteers, our work spans over 75 districts nationwide.



Our humanitarian response in Gaza has provided clean water to over 1.5 million people, served more than 2.2 million individuals through cooked meal programs, and delivered food assistance to over 12,000 families. We have supported 4,400+ children through educational assistance, distributed Eid relief packages to 35,000 families, and provided 1,800 mattresses to displaced households. In addition, we have delivered over USD 160,000 in cash assistance, reached more than 174,000 beneficiaries through Qurbani distributions, and provided medical assistance to over 280,000 people affected by the ongoing crisis.



In Turkey, provided post-earthquake food, winter shelter kits, and medical aid to thousands. Over \$21,000 in humanitarian support-delivered globally.

HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE IN GAZA



In response to the escalating humanitarian crisis in Gaza, our organization launched a large-scale emergency relief program aimed at addressing critical needs across food security, healthcare, shelter, and education. The ongoing conflict, compounded by economic blockades, had left families without access to clean water, medical care, or stable shelter. Hospitals were overwhelmed, thousands displaced, and children deprived of basic necessities, prompting an urgent and comprehensive intervention.

GAZA

PAWT has provided clean water to over 1.5 million people, served more than 2.2 million cooked meals, distributed bread to 680,000 beneficiaries, and delivered food assistance, including flour bags for 15,000 families and Eid relief packages for 35,000 families. We have also sponsored and cared for over 4,500 orphans and provided books and stationery to 4,400 students, supporting education during the crisis. Our shelter and protection efforts include 3,600 shelter homes, 31 fiber homes, and 115 sanitation units for displaced families. Through cash assistance exceeding USD 670,000, we have met urgent needs, while healthcare initiatives have reached over 280,000 beneficiaries through medical assistance, 5 medical camps, and 5,000 first-aid kits. In addition, our Qurbani program benefited more than 174,000 people. These interventions reflect our commitment to saving lives, protecting vulnerable populations, and strengthening recovery, resilience, and dignity in crisis-affected communities.

INFORMATION ON PROJECTS COMPLETED BY PAWT

01 EDUCATION & LITERACY

Education

Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT has established schools, Madaris, and Makatib to promote accessible and quality education, providing students with essential books, stationery, and learning materials. Our education initiatives have benefited more than 50,000 students, including 500 through computer labs and 250 through solar-powered labs that enhance digital learning opportunities. In Gaza, we have established 16 Quranic Makatib and distributed books and stationery to over 4,400 students, ensuring continued access to education and religious learning even in challenging circumstances.



02 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Cash Assistance

Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT also provides cash assistance to unemployed individuals and families affected by natural disasters, enabling them to meet their immediate and essential needs with dignity. To date, more than 25,000 people have benefited from financial support totaling over PKR 250 million across Pakistan, while humanitarian cash assistance exceeding USD 670,000 has been distributed to vulnerable communities in Gaza.

03 FOOD SECURITY AND NUTRITION

Provision of food

Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT provides comprehensive food assistance to vulnerable communities through ration packages, cooked meals, Sehri and Iftar distributions across Pakistan. In Gaza, our food security interventions include the distribution of flour bags, ration packages, milk for infants, fresh fruits, vegetables and bread, helping families meet their essential nutritional needs during times of crisis.

Pakistan

PAWT has distributed over 500,000 ration packages, provided cooked meals to more than 1.1 million families, supported over 235,500 households through Ramadan assistance programs, and delivered 900+ Suhoor packages to vulnerable communities across Pakistan.

FOOD SECURITY GAZA

Nutrition Support

Gaza

In Gaza, PAWT has distributed ration packages to over 12,000 families, flour bags to 15,000 families, and fresh fruits and vegetables to 42,000 families. Our food assistance programs have also provided cooked meals to more than 2.2 million people, bread to over 680,000 beneficiaries, and infant milk to 22,500 infants, helping meet the critical nutritional needs of vulnerable communities.

04 Clothing & Basic Needs Support

Essential Needs

📍 Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT relief programs provide essential clothing and winter support to vulnerable communities. In Pakistan, clothes have been distributed to more than 200,000 deserving individuals, while in Gaza, we have provided 21,000 blankets, warm clothing for over 46,000 people, and 1,600 mattresses to help families cope with harsh weather conditions and displacement.

05 Faith Infrastructure & Religious Services

📍 Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT development initiatives have strengthened access to religious education and worship facilities. In Pakistan, we have constructed 58 mosques benefiting more than 4,500 worshippers and 2,500 students. In Gaza, we have established 7 tent mosques and 16 Quranic Makatib, providing communities with spaces for worship, religious learning, and spiritual support during challenging times.

BLANKET DISTRIBUTIONS

📍 Pakistan

PAWT seasonal relief programs provide clothing, quilts, and other essential items to widows, orphans, and vulnerable families, helping them stay warm, protected, and dignified during harsh weather conditions. Thousands of deserving individuals have benefited from this support, which not only addresses immediate needs but also restores a sense of care, comfort, and belonging among some of the most vulnerable members of society.

MOSQUITO NET DISTRIBUTIONS

📍 Pakistan

Mosquito nets were distributed to flood-affected families to help protect them from mosquito-borne diseases and reduce health risks in emergency settings. This initiative contributed to improved health, hygiene, and living conditions for vulnerable communities during and after disaster situations.



06 Eid Relief Package

Community development

📍 Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT Eid programs bring joy and essential support to vulnerable families and children. In Pakistan, we have distributed over 270,000 Eid relief packages containing basic necessities for women and children. In Gaza, we have provided Eid relief packages to more than 35,000 families, organized Eid celebration programs for 38,000 children, and distributed special Eid gift packages to over 4,500 orphaned children, helping them share in the spirit of the occasion with dignity and happiness.

07 VOCATIONAL CENTRE

Women empowerment

📍 Shahpur, Shangla (KPK)

PAWT vocational training programs empower widows, orphans, and deserving women with practical skills that promote self-reliance and sustainable livelihoods. To date, more than 1,000 beneficiaries have received training in sewing, embroidery, beautician services, and other income-generating trades, equipping them with the knowledge and skills needed to achieve financial independence, improve household incomes, and build a better future for themselves and their families.

08 4.2. Health & Medical Services

Health care

📍 Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT healthcare programs provide essential medical support through welfare hospitals, free medical camps, ambulance services, mobile clinics, veterinary services, and emergency relief interventions. In Pakistan, more than 500,000 people have benefited from over 3,000 medical camps, while 250 animals received treatment through veterinary camps. In Gaza, we have conducted 5 medical camps, distributed 5,000 first-aid kits, provided medical assistance to over 280,000 people, and extended financial support to injured individuals, healthcare workers, and medical staff, helping ensure access to critical care during times of crisis.



09

Emergency Response & Disaster Risk Reduction

Emergency Relief

📍 Pakistan, Gaza, Turkey

PAWT disaster response programs support communities affected by natural disasters and humanitarian crises. In Pakistan, over 7.5 million people have benefited from relief and recovery efforts, including permanent homes, tent shelters, schools, and mosques. In Gaza, we provide food, health-care, livelihoods, shelter, water, sanitation, and infrastructure support, while emergency aid was also delivered to earthquake-affected communities in Turkey.

Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH)

Provision of water

📍 GAZA

Access to clean water remains a key component of PAWT humanitarian response in Gaza. We have provided safe drinking water to more than 1.5 million people through a combination of water distribution programs, water tankers, boreholes, and water reservoir tanks. These interventions help ensure reliable access to clean water for vulnerable communities, reducing the risk of waterborne diseases and improving public health in areas affected by conflict and displacement.

Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH)

Provision of water

📍 Pakistan

PAWT water, sanitation, and hygiene initiatives have improved access to safe and clean drinking water for more than 850,000 people and over 400,000 livestock through the implementation of 1,150 water supply projects across Pakistan. In addition, the installation of water coolers in schools and public institutions has provided chilled drinking water to over 22,000 students and teachers, promoting health, well-being, and a better learning environment.

Tree Plantation

Environmental Sustainability

📍 Pakistan

As part of PAWT's commitment to environmental sustainability and climate resilience, Pak Aid Welfare Trust has planted more than 15,000 trees across Pakistan, contributing to environmental conservation, climate adaptation, and greener communities. In Gaza, we have supported agricultural livelihoods by assisting with the cultivation and rehabilitation of over 150 kanal of agricultural land, helping vulnerable families strengthen food security and build long-term resilience.

Housing and Shelter support

Infrastructure development

📍 Pakistan, Gaza

PAWT provides safe and dignified shelter for disaster-affected and displaced communities. In Pakistan, we have built 20 permanent houses, 10,000+ tent shelters, 10 tent schools and mosques, and 50 bamboo huts. In Gaza, we have delivered 3,600 shelter homes, 31 fiber houses, 115 sanitation units, canopies for 2,700 families, 1,200 rain covers, and 1,600 mattresses, ensuring safer living conditions for vulnerable families.

📍 Pakistan, Gaza

Pak Aid Welfare Trust Qurbani program serves as a vital source of nutrition and support for vulnerable communities during Eid-ul-Adha. In Pakistan, the initiative has reached more than 1.5 million beneficiaries, while in Gaza it has benefited over 174,000 people. Collectively, the program has facilitated the sacrifice and distribution of meat from more than 2,500 animals, ensuring that thousands of deserving families can share in the blessings of Eid with dignity and nourishment.

Livelihood Development and Economic Empowerment**Poverty Alleviation**

📍 Pakistan

As part of our self-sufficiency and livelihood development program, we support vulnerable families through sustainable income-generating opportunities. To date, 50 welding plants have been established and goats have been distributed to disabled and deserving individuals, enabling them to earn a livelihood while improving household nutrition through access to milk. Through these initiatives, more than 250 beneficiaries have been empowered to strengthen their economic resilience and work toward long-term self-reliance.

Community Cohesion**Reconciliation & civic engagements**

📍 Pakistan, Gaza

Our community cohesion initiatives promote peace, social harmony, and psychological well-being. Through mediation efforts, we have resolved 468 murder-related cases, settled 350 property disputes, and reconciled 524 family disputes. We also conduct Independence Day programs across Pakistan to foster national unity, while in Gaza, psychological relief activities support children affected by conflict and displacement.

PARTNERSHIPS & COLLABORATIONS

PAWT maintains strong collaborations with corporate donors, philanthropists, and international partners to enhance the scale and impact of its humanitarian efforts. Key corporate supporters include GlaxoSmithKline, Bank Islami, Ghani Glass, Rajby Industries, and Orient Electronics. International partnerships have been formalized through MOUs with Basir Social Assistance (Turkey) and Pak Aid Welfare USA. The organization holds regulatory approvals, including certification from the Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP) and foreign funding clearance from the Economic Affairs Division. Nationally, PAWT actively engages with the Pak-Afghan Cooperation Forum and works in alliance with various local civil society organizations (CSOs).

The Executive Committee of the organization is led by Chairman Rashid Ahmed, with Muhammad Tanveer serving as General Secretary and Ansir Khan as Finance Secretary. Mufti Naeem Shahid holds the dual responsibility of Chief Executive Officer and Executive Director, while Farooq Hussain Shah serves as Managing Director. Together, this leadership team brings diverse expertise and strategic direction, ensuring effective governance, strong organizational performance, and the sustainable delivery of humanitarian and development impact.



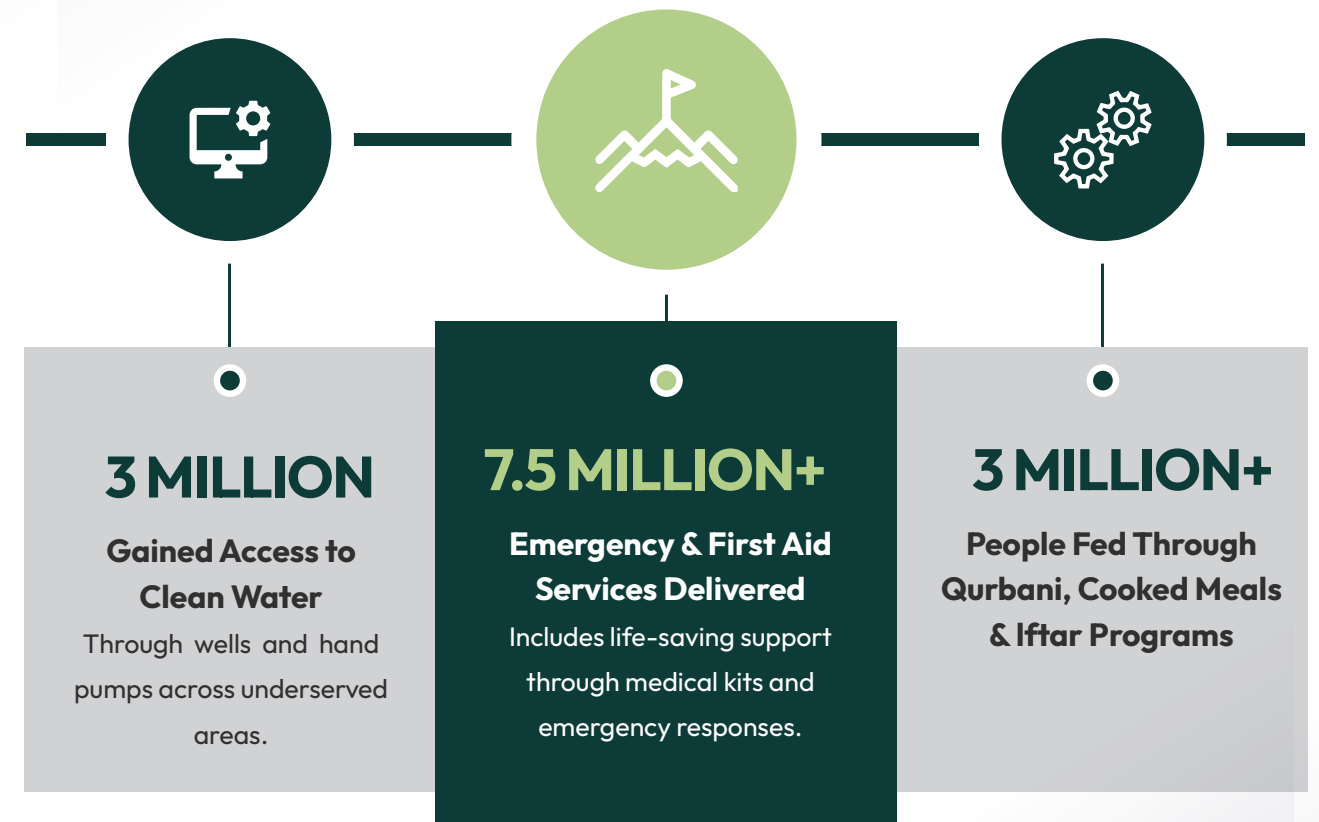
